On the back of this flyer is the donation form for the catastrophic leave bank. We are still collecting donations of one day per each certificated employee. We have started the school year with several employees who will need to use donated days to keep them financially whole while they deal with health issues. It is not too late to donate. We will no longer be collecting days on an individual basis. This new system allows privacy and confidentially for the employee, along with being able to have immediate access of sick leave days for those who are dealing with catastrophic illnesses. Reporting Deadlines

If you get the Star Newspaper, you may have read this week that SEA was late reporting campaign expenditures for our school board candidates, Scott Blough and Jeanne Davis. The county sent a notice in September listing changes in reporting deadlines. We misinterpreted the notice and as a result were late in filing one report. As soon as were aware of our mistake, we immediately submitted the late paperwork. There were no repercussions, contrary to the Star reporting that there might be a fine. Had the newspaper followed-up by calling back the county, it would have been reported that there was no fine.

As you know, newspapers look for sensational stories, especially during a campaign season. We're sure we were targeted since we are a teacher association. The late filing does not rise to the level of newsworthy, but in a campaign season, where there is manipulation and positioning, the Star gave unendorsed candidates a platform to comment and criticize.

- Supported by Silicon Valley billionaires whose agenda is to dismantle public education and replace with a voucher system that favors the upper class. He received \$6 million in donations in the past week.
- Supports high stakes testing along with evaluating teachers based on student test scores.
